City Manager Olson informed the Commission of a water main break on Varnum Street last week; the asphalt patching was completed today, they had been delayed because of weather; the Industrial Park Drive and Lake Street - H-58 asphalt work will begin and hopefully be finished next week. As for the Noise Ordinance regarding the fireworks, City Attorney Ferguson has been working with the Manager and they are fine tuning it. September 1, 2014 minimum wage went up to \$8.15 per hour Olson stated that the City is in compliance with this increase. Regarding the Cemetery well, Kleiman Pump and Well Drilling pulled the pump the motor and pump were both seized up; currently we are trying to track down an electrical issue with the pump. The Cox Addition Project is moving along the bond and loan closing were completed today, the first Progress Meeting will be Thursday at 1:00 p.m. at City Hall; things are on schedule at this time. City Manager Olson stated that the City is engaged with seven engineering firms on nine projects all in different stages.
