A. CALL TO ORDER REGULAR CITY COMMISSION MEETING, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, ROLL CALL

Rob Lundquist with Munising Bay Trail Network asked about the status of the grant for the Mountain Bike Trail Project. Currently the contract is at City Attorney Ferguson's for his review. We are waiting for final approval with the changes submitted. The DNR is backlogged so we do not have a tentative approval date at this time. Lundquist also asked about the City's appropriated \$10,000.00 and how it would be paid out. City Manager Olson stated that it would be in the form of a check. Mayor DesJardins stated that we are also looking into a Recreation Grant in the amount of \$50,000.00 with a 50/50 match to cover some of the costs.

Resolution of the Adoption of the Alger County Hazard Mitigation Plan

WHEREAS, hazard mitigation is defined as any action taken before, during, or after a disaster or emergency to permanently eliminate or reduce the long-term risk to human life and property from natural and technological hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government, the State of Michigan, Alger County and the City of Munising all recognize the importance of preventing or lessening the damage and impact of disasters and emergencies through hazard mitigation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Munising has a unique role to play in coordinating the hazard mitigation activities of federal and state and local governments by identifying local county hazards; and assisting possible mitigation efforts; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that technical experts from state and local government and private industry are brought together to foster and promote the implementation of hazard mitigation measures; and

WHEREAS, increased coordination can assist in lowering future disaster relief expenditures and increasing the level of public safety for the City of Munising; and

WHEREAS, the City of Munising may from time to time solicit, review and identify hazard mitigation projects for funding consideration under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance, as amended), the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program (section 203 of the Stafford Act, 42 U.S.C 5133), the Flood Mitigation Assistance Program (section 1366 of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended), The Severe Repetitive Loss Program (section 1361A of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended) and the Repetitive Flood Claims Program (section 1361A of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the City of Munising adopts the 2015 Alger County Hazard Mitigation Plan.
