7. City Manager Report

BACCO is wrapping the majority of the large-scale work items for the 2020 construction season at this point. As of October 5th, two-way traffic was restored on both M-28 and Superior St. The historic style street lights will be delivered to the electrical subcontractor next week as well as the backordered MDOT specified wire that will facilitate installation of the lighting. BACCO hopes to complete the M-28/Superior intersection as well as the extension of the passing lane to the Anna River bridge prior to snowfall this year. The execution of the City of Munising/Grand Island Township franchise agreement has put the sewer project funding into high gear. We are in the process of working with UPEA and the USDA on submitting our final documents for the bond/grant process. We will continue to move at an accelerated pace on the funding due to the current ability to close at sub 1.5% interest rates.

Administration continues to work with Bakertilly on the establishment of a S&P bond rating for the sale of the refunding revenue backed bonds. The refunding of the revenue backed bonds is a lengthy process however it is going smoothly. We expect to have a potential bond placement in the next 6-8 weeks for this refunding which will require City Commission approval.

The City is preparing to make the transition into winter operations at this point. The public works department spent a week screening and cleaning the dredging tailings in order to be utilized for our winter sand. The previous dredging location by the WWTP will be utilized for snow storage this

winter as we will not be utilizing the Pictured Rocks Cruises parking lot this year. The public works crew will also be removing and storing any summer items such as plants, benches, and bike racks that were placed out this spring. The fall pickup will begin this week as the early leaf change has kick started some fall cleaning. Reminders will be placed in the paper as well as on our social media reminding residents about the "paper bag" requirement as well as the size and branch dimensions. Individuals and commercial contractors continue to abuse our drop-off site and our "orchard" area with items such as furniture, tires, and loads of construction debris. Flotation Docking will be spending a day at Bayshore Marina this week

Flotation Docking will be spending a day at Bayshore Marina this week assisting our marina staff and public works department in winterizing the floating docks for the year. Flotation docking will be placing a flexible gangway connection on the shore side of the gangway this year to enable the dock to move independently of the sheet piling. The three 50' slips on the east side of the dock will also be removed from the main dock and safely tucked inside of the L-dock for the winter.

City Manager Olson added that the BACCO crew and our Water Crew had an issue with the water system, trying to locate a shut off. Also, the new docks have been anchored down for the winter season.

Commissioner Ballas asked about Trick or Treating this year. Olson stated that he has not heard anything from the Police Department but will keep her informed when he does.

Commissioner Berry mentioned a hazard on Elm Ave. people are parking where there is no space to go to Falling Rock.
