6. City Manager Report

Administration continues to move forward on a number of items related to delinquent taxes as well as utility bills. The recently adopted water/sewer ordinance authorizes and requires the administrative addition of past due utility bill to winter tax bills. The City Attorney has laid out the legal framework for the task and we expect past due bills to be sent to the County within the next two weeks. The County will put the past due utility bills on the property taxes and will ensure the City utility funds are made whole. There are also a small handful of legally uncollectible past due accounts that will be handled administratively.

Our utilities department will also begin the utility shutoff process for customers who have not fulfilled the requirements of the cross-connection control program being administered by HydroCorp. Most parcels that have been selected for inspections have been fulfilled the requirements however a number of parcels are not in compliance. The accounts in question have received at least three inspections notices with the third being titled "Final Notice" We expect to have shut-off door hangers out in the next couple of weeks but intend on attaching three methods in which HydroCorp can be contacted in order to be brought into compliance. The City has contracted with HydroCorp for a three-year project in which 1/3 of the inspections occur each year. Next year will be the third and final year so we will be stepping up compliance efforts.

Next month, the City Treasurer and myself will be working on reconciling our delinquent past due personal property taxes. Much like the past due utility accounts, our City Attorney has provided the framework for administration to follow so we can bring our delinquent personal property taxes current. We have reached out to the County Treasurer who has agreed to provide assistance to the City as we will need to file for collections in small claims court.

Circuit Court Judge Rahilly made a final ruling on the Planning Commissions conditional approval of a conditional use permit off of H-58. Judge Rahilly granted the Cities request for summary judgement which effectively put an end to the case and the appeals timeline ran out last week. Bill Nordeen took the lead on the case for the City and proved to be an extremely competent municipal attorney.

The City continues to work with the Superior Watershed Partnership on potential EV Charger projects. After onsite meetings with UPPCO and the SWP, we are moving forward on a grant application to EGLE. UPPCO and the City are tentative partners in the project however we have no legal or financial obligations currently. An agreement with the potential EV Charger company has made the rounds between attorneys and final draft is being compiled may be at a future City Commission meeting for tentative approval.

Just as a reminder, the City Charter requires an organizational meeting be held the first Monday following an election. This will put the organizational meeting on Monday, November $14^{\rm th}$, at 6 PM.

Commissioner Eckert asked about how many shut offs will happen for non-compliance regarding Hydro Corp. There have been several attempts to get everyone's homes inspected. So no one has been shut off yet.

Commissioner Ballas asked about the election and if they don't win when are the done? After the election an Organizational meeting will be scheduled for November $14^{\rm th}$, so up until the election.
