6. City Manager Report

Infrastructure projects within the City continue to advance despite the recent turn in weather. Both BACCO and Gerou Excavating had to push their paving crews back a handful of days to allow for the snow to melt and preparation work to continue. Paving on both M-28 and Walnut Street should occur within the next nine days. Restoration as well as winter preparation should begin shortly thereafter.

Coleman Engineering is continuing to move forward with both the H-58 and downtown street rehabilitation. The environmental review process has been completed and approved and Coleman is continuing on to the design and planning phase of the project. Phase 5 of H-58 is slated to be out to bid in early spring of 2022 with a construction start date of June 2022. The lead engineer on the project, Scott Nowack, and myself have a conference call with the MDOT grant division.

The DDA has also contracted with Coleman Engineering for the 2022 Downtown Street project. Coleman completed their survey work of the downtown two weeks ago and was in town this past week doing road/soil borings in preparation for the project. The DDA made the decision to fund a portion of the grant match with fund balance dollars with roughly half of the overall cost being issued as a infrastructure bond.

The City's annual onsite audit work was performed during the week of 11/1/21 and was uneventful. This year's audit will be slightly more complicated due to our refunding bonds and a mandated single audit due to the amount of federal dollars that were spent. Our Auditors, Anderson-Tackman, expect to have the audit completed in the next six weeks with an audit presentation to the City Commission during the first quarter of the year.

City administration and our financial advisor, Bakertilly, completed our S & P rating call the week of October 25th. Additional documents were supplied and we are now awaiting our bond rating. Once the bond rating is received our advisor and bond attorney, Miller-Canfield, will begin working on finalizing the bonds as well as prepare for a sale of the bond. The bond market continues to be favorable for the City and as long as the market situation does not change we will continue to move forward.

The City in conjunction with the DDA has submitted our official notice of intent for a Low-Moderate Income (LMI) survey of the City. Once approved by the MEDC, CUPPAD will begin to send out information to the randomly selected residents. Barring any unseen hurdles, we hope to have the survey completed and submitted for final review sometime this winter.

Also, City Manager stated that Walnut St. is paved today, BACCO is racing to get things buttoned up. City Hall will be closed on Friday the $12^{\rm th}$ for lighting upgrades. The chlorine being added to the water will be ending hopefully by the end of next month.

Olson was asked about the black topping of the sidewalks. Olson stated that MDOT is in charge of the project.
