9. City Manager Report

Construction has essentially wrapped up on all City and State projects within the City of Munising. The last batch of pavement was installed on M-28 after a brief battle with winter conditions however they have completed this years scope of work on the roadway. BACCO's asphalt plant suffered a break down on the last day of operations and the last few small stretches of the multiuse path was not able to be paved, as well as the restoration of the construction area will resume in the spring.

Myself and staff from Coleman engineering are finalizing the grant documents for the DDA downtown rehabilitation project. The project is a direct grant and will not require the City to administer the project through the MDOT Local Agency Program. Coleman's survey and soil boring crews were in town this month and have completed all survey work in preparation for completing the plan set. The crew from Coleman found that a majority of borings showed a well compacted and stable sub base however the existing layer of asphalt is significantly deteriorated and multiple locations showed the asphalt layer being only a fraction of the thickness of today MDOT standards.

UPEA and myself continue to work with Grand Island Township to finalize the plans and paperwork to facilitate our potential sanitary sewer extension. We are working towards nailing down a final dollar amount with Smith Construction and transpose that to our agreements with the Ramsey's and Holiday Inn. The township has asked that the lift station location be changed and the accompanying underground work be modified to facilitate the relocation. The request by the Township has translated into a small cost savings on the project which Smith has agreed to in principle.

The approved budget for FY 2021-22 contained an expenditure for a comprehensive wage and benefit analysis for all full-time positions within the Organization. I have been working with a non-profit to help identify and solicit proposals for the study. I hope to have at least one proposal on the Commission agenda for later this month.

Anderson-Tackman has completed their on-site work and will spend the next month working on completing our audit. This year's audit will be a little more involved as our refunding bonds and a required single audit of our water project have slightly complicated our audit. We expect that the audit will be completed prior to the $23^{\rm rd}$ with all required documents being submitted to the State Department of Treasury prior to our January $1^{\rm st}$ deadline.

City Hall will be closed on December $24^{\rm th}$, $27^{\rm th}$, $29^{\rm th}$, and January $3^{\rm rd}$. City Manager Olson also stated that the State of Michigan has put a halt on the Low to Moderate Income program. Commissioner Ballas asked about the multi-use path, bike path non-motorized path signage will be put up. Also, asked about was the resurfacing of Superior St. Olson explained that this is a DDA project and the street will be mill and overlay. Commissioner Bogater asked about the stop sign on Chocolay St. and Elm Ave. and the fact that no one stops there. It is a four way stop and has been for some time, possibly a little more Police presence would help. Olson informed the Commission that the Ake campsite project has been approved by the Planning Commission with 17 conditions.

Correspondence included a letter from MDOT regarding a 2024 bridge repair notice of for the Anna River Bridge, this will pay for the bridge repairs.
