7. City Manager Report

Carl Linquist from the Superior Watershed Partnership informed the City this week that EGLE did not award the car charging grant application that was submitted with eCamion chargers. Carl and the fellow stake holders in the project have changed directions and have now identified another charger provider, ChargePoint. ChargePoint systems would also be placed in several other regional communities as part of the same Partnership facilitated project. A new lease agreement has been provided and submitted to the City Attorney for review and comment will hopefully be to the Commission in the near future.

Mike Grentz from Anderson-Tackman will be joining us during the February $20^{\rm th}$ City Commission meeting. Mike will be providing a summary of our audit however Commissioners and staff should have their copies of the audit present as well.

The Munising Public Schools Board were unanimously in favor of the school resource officer MOU. The MOU has been signed and the position has a start date of February $1^{\rm st}$. Administration at both the City and School system will continue to look at long term funding solutions in an effort to provide the contracted service on a long-term basis.

City staff is preparing to submit a mini-grant application to EGLE for facility upgrades to improve energy efficiency. Utilizing the energy audit that was provided by Ginger VanConet, two well houses and the Washington Street booster station were selected as high priority facilities for improvements. The grant has a \$25,000 maximum award and would be a 50/50 cost share. The improvements that will be submitted within the grant application consist of insulation installation, pump drive upgrades, and heating improvements. These improvements were identified as low-cost investments with a very short return on investment which is a priority for EGLE.

The City's new Western Star plow truck was finished and put into service this past Monday. The unit is the first new plow truck for the City in 15 years and will now serve as the primary unit with the 2009 International paystar as secondary. The 2006 International heavy plow truck will be shifted to a reserve unit which has been unfilled since 2017 when the City sold a previous plow truck that we could no longer afford to operate and maintain.

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Regretfully, I am not able to be attendance for the Commission meeting as I am in Grand Rapids for the Michigan Municipal Executives Winter Institute. This past fall I was elected by my peers to serve on the organizations Board of Directors. The board meets quarterly and will not interfere with future Commission meetings.

Commissioner Eckert asked about the large pot hole by the mill where the semi- trucks pull in. Clerk Roberts stated that she would talk to Tom Anderson, also Mayor Nettleton stated that he would talk to the City Manager as well.

Commissioner Ballas asked about the energy audits and the fact that she asked for information on solar energy. City Clerk Roberts indicated that she would get the message to the City Manager.

D. CORRESPONDENCE

Correspondence was from the Michigan State University Extension office regarding capital asset management and planning. An invitation for local government elected and appointed officials.

E. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Brice Burge inquired about the City's meetings, and the fact that there is only one of him and meetings from the City, County, School, etc. all meet at about the same time. He would like the Commission to think about using different dates and times for their meetings.
