9. City Manager Report

City Manager Olson stated that the MDOT-M-28 2020 project bids came in higher than expected. The low bid was roughly \$15.5 million, this is about 8.4% over the engineers estimate. Due to the uneven bid results there will be a review of items bid on. A full bid matrix has not been released. The preliminary numbers have the water and sewer portions in it and they are significantly under budget. Regarding ditching EGLE turned our minor permit applications around in 5 days. Tomorrow Brook and Prospect Streets will be ditched. Bell Ave. will require swamp mats they should be delivered this week. Sand Point is scheduled for March 30th. Sheridan Street next to the trailer park was completed last week, toboggans, timbers and couches were buried in the ditch. As of today, Gary VanLandschoot has rescinded his objection to the Commercial Street alley vacation, we will continue to move forward with this. As for security systems, Olson met with LASCO Technologies last week and spent an afternoon with them reviewing our security camera needs. City Hall including the chambers camera with a microphone system, the Wastewater Treatment Plant, Department of Public Works, Marina and Police-Fire Hall are all in the mix. Regarding the COVID-19 City Hall will be closed to walk-in customers as of March $17^{\rm th}$. We will be fully staffed, we will also be evaluating utility and policing operations, limiting contact with residents and customers. We will reevaluate the situation on March 30^{th} with an assessment of relevant recommendations and guidance. All non-essential face to face interactions have been cancelled except the Planning Commission Meeting on the 25th and the City Commission Meeting on April 1st.
