5. City Manager Report

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The City of Munising has spent the last five weeks operating only our critical functions through staffing shift changes and modifying our processes to help limit possible COVID -19 exposure. The Alger County Emergency Management office has been able to effectively source N-90/95 masks, sanitizers, and face shield for our staff and for that we are thankful. Effective May 11th, we will bring our staffing levels back to 100 percent with normal shifts however I will be issuing a new set of operating best practices prior to that day as we continue to adjust to our work demands while limiting contact with other employees and the public. We will be bringing our water systems online our campground and marina but will not provide any staffed service at either location until further notice. We will also be keeping all public restrooms at our water front parks closed until further notice as well.

We continue to work on our upcoming FY 2020-21 budget and will have it out to the Commission for review before the end of the month. MDOT releases a revised three-year projection for transportation funding which included a decrease of over 8% in funds for FY 20-21 and around 5% for the two trailing fiscal years. No projections revised revenue sharing projections have been issued to date however the consensus is that both MDOT and the State of Michigan General Fund projections are still fluid numbers and will only continue to decrease as gas tax and sales tax revenues have not rebounded this quarter as originally expected.

MDOT is moving full steam ahead on the M-28 project and will begin in earnest on May 11th. BACCO, MDOT, and the City are continuing to reevaluate our original construction stages as our projected traffic estimates in certain locations will be drastically different than historic trends. Although exact locations and start dates are not nailed down at this time, the area from the H-58/M-28 intersection running east to the Anna River Bridge will be the first section to be addressed. Our Public Works/Streets Department will be spending the next few weeks sweeping the M-28 corridor and addressing any maintenance issues in order to limit our time on the M-28 during the remainder of the construction season.

CUPPAD will begin our Low-Moderate Income survey in the next few weeks as well. CUPPAD will be utilizing our software data bases to do random selections for our survey. As a safety precaution, surveys will be mailed to individuals rather than the traditional door to door survey style. The MEDC is continuing to process rental rehabilitation application for the "Harley Store Apartments" as well as our submitted proposal for a planning grant. The Planning Commission and their work on the master plan is on a hiatus as we continue to navigate virtual meetings and the inability to effectively hold public hearings as required by the State of Michigan Planning Enabling Act.

Commissioner Ballas asked about the restrooms at the City Marina, for the Farmer's Market. City Manager Olson stated that until the executive order is removed the restrooms have to be closed. Commissioner Ballas also asked about the Summer Watering Permits, they are still \$20.00 and can be purchased through the month of May.
