City Manager Report

Capital Projects

- The City of Munising currently has a number of 2025 projects that are out to bid. MDOT has the Anna River Bridge project included in its March 7th bid opening package. MDOT will review the proposal and bids submitted by contractors and then provide a summary to the City. If the low bid is no more than 10% over of the engineers' estimate and MDOT budget, the project will automatically be awarded. If it is higher than the 10% threshold, then we need to work with MDOT on either revising scope items in the project, or by getting additional funding for the project.
- The City of Munising Major and Local streets project is out to bid with bid opening occurring on March $12^{\rm th}$ at City Hall. This project contains a crush and shape job on Cemetery Hill and Grand Ave. and a mill and overlay project on the 300-600 blocks of Superior St.
- The last remaining street project that is yet to go out to bid is a City-wide crack seal project. The project aims to provide comprehensive crack sealing across all local streets. The project will require potential bidders to perform onsite investigations of our streets so we will be waiting for the snow and ice pack to be completely thawed.

Administrative Items

- Glenn Anderson from the MML is completing the draft of the City of Munising Community and Manager profile and has been incorporating the Commission's comments and input. Glenn anticipates the completion of the draft during the week of March $3^{\rm rd}$ with a final review occurring at that time. Glenn will also be joining us for our March $17^{\rm th}$ meeting to review the search and provide a revised timeline.
- Coleman Engineering is completing the draft of the City of Munising non-motorized transportation plan. Coleman planners and engineers performed a condition assessment review of the existing paths and sidewalks in the City and have begun compiling the information. They have also worked with community partners on additional non-motorized transportation needs in the City such as dedicated pedestrian paths and crossings from M-28/H-58 eastbound to the Grandview apartments as well as the addition of a dedicated path on Sand Point from Munising Falls to Sand Point.
- CUPPAD and the Planning Commission have begun to finalize the Community Survey for the Master Plan revision project. Our planner, Ryan Soucy, will be finalizing the last few items on the survey and it is expected to be released to the Community in the next two weeks. The survey will be out for a month and will be available in both online and hardcopy formats.

WHEREAS, the City of Munising, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Act, being Act 381 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan of 1996, as amended (the "Act"), has formally resolved to participate in the Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (BRA) of Alger County (the "Authority") and have designated that all related activities shall proceed through the BRA; and

WHEREAS, the Authority, pursuant to and in accordance with Section 13 of the Act, has reviewed, and recommended for approval by the Munising City Commission, the Brownfield Plan (the "Plan") attached hereto, to be carried out within the City of Munising, relating to the development of property located at 355 Elm Avenue, Munising, Michigan (the "Site"), as shown in Figures 1 and 2 of the Plan and more particularly described in the legal description of the property contained within the attached Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Munising City Commission have reviewed the Plan, and have been provided a reasonable opportunity to express their views and recommendations regarding the Plan and in accordance with Section 14(5) of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Alger County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority has passed a resolution supporting the adoption of the Plan;

WHEREAS, the Munising City Commissioners have made the following determinations and findings:

- 1. The Plan constitutes a public purpose under the Act;
- 2. The Plan meets all of the requirements for a Brownfield plan set forth in Section 13 of the Act;
- 3. The proposed method of financing the costs of the eligible activities, as described in the Plan, was feasible and the Authority has the ability to arrange the financing;
- 4. The costs of the eligible activities proposed in the Plan are reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act; and
- 5. The amount of captured taxable value estimated to result from the adoption of the Plan is reasonable; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the review of the Plan the Munising City Commission concurs with the approval of the individual Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. **Plan Support**. Pursuant to the authority vested in the Munising City Commission, by the Act, the Plan is hereby supported in the form attached to this Resolution.
- 2. **Severability**. Should any section, clause, or phrase of this Resolution be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity

of this Resolution as a whole nor any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

3. Repeals. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed.
