Abigail Wallace with Michigan Environmental Council informed the Commission about their mission. They are a non-profit organization. There are lots of projects in Alger County. They are the first Green Bank that can offer low interest loans for updates with power, insulation etc. Munising Township is currently working on some solar projects around \$200,000.00 in grants were awarded to Alger County. At some point Michigan Environmental Council will eventually ask for a letter of support from the City of Munising.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Capital Projects

- Varnum Street The City, UPEA, and Gerou Excavating met this week for the preconstruction meeting for the Varnum Street watermain project. The project will facilitate the install of roughly two blocks of 12 inch watermain. Once completed, the 12 inch main will run from the central water tank all the way to Browns Addition and provide sufficient flow and velocity for the west end of the City. This will allow the City to mothball the West tank once the wells at the Campground are online. The project has a tentative start date of May 20th which is subject to weather and weight restrictions.
- Campground Wells- The wells for the campground will be put online this upcoming month and new water quality samples will be taken. Last year's water quality samples showed an elevated level of sodium that could have a negative impact on infrastructure and consumption quality. Once new samples are completed, Coleman Engineering will be working with the City on identifying an adequate treatment system for the well system. Previous sampling results indicated that the regulated elements were within state drinking water requirements however water quality items were elevated.

Administrative and Operational Functions

- Marina and DPW staff have been surveying the damage to the floating dock system from the strong Northeast wind that occurred during the week of April 1st. It appears as though a number of bolt tabs will need to be welded on their respective docks with one dock also suffering some damage to the decking.
- Administration is working on compiling our draft budget for the 2024-25 fiscal year. The budget will be presented to the City Commission at the May $20^{\rm th}$ meeting and a date will be scheduled for a budget review for Commissioners at that time.
- Training dates and times AED/CPR training for City Staff and officials is currently being finalized. Once dates and times are finalized for the training, this will be communicated via email.
- DPW staff will begin our spring operations in the upcoming weeks, this will include street sweeping, right of way restorations, and lawn waste pickup and drop off.
- Treasury announced last week that the City of Munising was selected for an assessment roll audit. This is a routine audit and any significant findings will be communicated to the Commission.

E. NEW CITY BUSINESS

1. DDA-Partnerships updates Kathy Reynolds

Kathy stated that since the City has reached Redevelopment Ready Community (RRC) certification status we are eligible for a Match on Main funding. MEDC, the DDA and EDC met and have an application ready to forward to the State of Michigan for rating and awarding. This is around \$25,000.00 grant with a 10% match. She mentioned the Annual Chamber dinner May 13, 2024 where Mr. Ramsey would be awarded. There will also be an Art Banner Contest next year for aging banners in town.

Proposed Summer Water Permit Policy and Fee

April 15th, 2024

The City of Munising Water and Sewer Ordinance stipulates that the annual Summer Watering Permits be administered via a policy adopted by the City Commission. The updated ordinance modifies the account assignment by requiring that all accounts be placed in the owner of the parcels name and not a tenant. The ordinance as well as our USDA -Rural Development bond documents stipulate that the City of Munising cannot provide free water and/or sewer service. The format below has been created by the administration to attempt to provide the traditional watering permit while meeting the requirements of our own ordinance.

Accompanying this proposed policy is a recommendation to increase permit fees to \$40.00 beginning in May of 2024. This recommendation is being made as the fee has not changed since 2008 and it would reflect the increase in rates over the same time period.

Proposed Summer Water Permit

Qualifications

- Parcel owner must have a positive consumption history of at least 8 months
- Parcel must have a Principal Residency Exception (PRE) of 50% or greater
- Parcel owner must apply for the Permit

Administration of Permit

- Permit Holders will have their sewer consumption charge adjusted to the highest charged usage within the previous 8 months billing or actual consumption, whichever is lowest
- Permits may be applied to June, July, August, and September's billing
- Permits must be purchased and paid in full prior to month in which it will be applied
 - o i.e. a permit purchased during the month of May will be applied to all four applicable months, a permit purchased in July will apply to August and September's billing periods.

10. Cemetery Fence
