CITY MANAGER REPORT

The State of Michigan has been busy the past couple of weeks announcing grant awards through a number of divisions. The Superior Watershed Partnership was awarded their grant application through EGLE for the installation of a number of EV chargers throughout the region. This past year, the City worked with partnership staff in identifying a suitable location for a charging location in the City Hall parking lot which was funded by EGLE. Staff as well as our City Attorney will continue to work with partnership staff on the installation of the chargers as well as identifying a timeframe.

EGLE's water division also released the list of awards for the Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund grants. The City's application scoring put us in the middle of the list however were not selected for funding. The State awarded \$546 Million in funds from ten different funding sources during this year's grant/loan process. The state also announced that they are expecting to award \$720 Million in the 2024 funding round so we are hopeful that next year's application will be funded. The funding request for the City was intended to be fully used on service line replacements which allows us to utilize a larger share of the ten funding sources that EGLE awards through the DWRLF.

Coleman Engineering and Payne and Dolan are finalizing the contract documents for the upcoming Sand Point Road project. Payne and Dolan did receive the notice of award and are currently preparing their performance bonds and final submittals. Although the project has a final completion date of June, 2024, they have communicated to us that they intend to perform the work this fall. Once we have a firm date on the calendar, we will be reaching out to the residents and park service as well as doing a social media update.

The Grand Island Township sewer project appears to be nearing final completion. Excel Energy group will be onsite next week to complete the final hookup of the remaining lift station items. This includes wiring the generator and transfer switch into the control panel as well as installing a pump relay for chemical addition. The past couple of weeks we have been dosing ferric into the wet well every four hours. With a pump relay and quill installed, it will allow for the addition of ferric directly into the waste line as it is pumped during a cycle. This will allow staff a high degree of accuracy and control for the dosage. Coleman is still scheduled to perform a smoke test in the area on Wednesday, September 20th.

Superior Paving has the City Hall parking lot on their schedule for the week of the 18th. City Staff removed a section of pavement this week and found that our decades old pothole in the parking lot was due to a partially demolished foundation allowing for settling of soil throughout the years. Public Works employees removed the foundation blocks and replaced the substandard soil with screen sand and a healthy amount of 22a gravel.

I had previously mentioned in my last manager's report that I will not be in attendance for the November $1^{\rm st}$ meeting, due to a change in schedule I will be in attendance for that meeting as well as the remainder of the 2023 meetings.
