CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Capital Projects

- Varnum Street- Gerou Excavating's subcontractor, Superior Paving, completed the base and top course of asphalt this week in the construction area. The contractor still has some remaining restoration items that need to be completed however the project appears that it will be open to the public ahead of schedule and on budget. A final pay request and final balancing change order will be on the September 16th City Commission Agenda.
- Bayshore Wellhouse Replacement- Olsen and Olsen Construction is preparing to begin the Bayshore Wellhouse replacement in the upcoming weeks. The contractors have provided their material submittals and have set up a "MISS DIG" for the parcel as well.
- Tourist Park Well Project— City staff met with Wandel's Watercare at the Tourist Park this past week and reviewed the well systems and controls. Due to elevated sodium and hardness levels, a small commercial water quality improvement system will be needed. Wandel's will be providing a proposal along with the identified treatment components in the coming weeks.
- <u>Tourist Park Bathroom Rehabs</u>- The City's engineering and architectural consultants met with staff this past week and performed a final review of the scope items of the upcoming bathroom rehabilitations. The West bathroom is budgeted to be completed over the winter months this year with bid documents being finalized and distributed in the next two weeks.

Administrative Items

- An Occupational Safety consultant from the Consultation, Education and Training (CET) division of MiOSHA performed a review of our facilities and operational items along with City staff. The CET division of MiOSHA performs proactive inspections and provides feedback on items that need to be addressed. Prior to 2020, I have tried to have CET consultants' perform facility inspections on a bi-annual basis however MiOSHA has not filled the UP-consultant position in over two years. No serious potential violations were found and the small items that were identified will be corrected in the near future.
- The City is preparing for our fall and early winter work items including several preventative maintenance and replacements of culverts. Where applicable, we have submitted permit applications to EGLE and are now in the review period. This work should be completed in the prior to the end of the calendar year.
