Report for City Commission Meeting

September 20, 2021

- 1. The DDA is currently working with Devin regarding the Superior Street road project that will happen next year. The board approved Coleman Engineering as the engineering firm for the project and is determining the breakdown of financing with the possibility of bonding some of the project.
- 2. A group has been meeting with the County Airport Committee to work towards future planning of the county airport. The second meeting is scheduled for the morning of Monday, September 20 with the likelihood of more to follow. This group (many of whom worked with the Hiawatha Forest Service in acquiring the property) is very eager to see the airport developed.
- 3. Tourism numbers have increased during the 2021 year with businesses doing well and it appears things will be steady (though slowing down) this fall. The office and our kiosk location at the dock has had an extremely busy year assisting visitors to the community.
- 4. Great Lakes Recovery will now have a location at Munising Memorial Hospital and staffed on a limited basis (at least initially). The need for their services is very important in communities. Great Lakes Recovery Centers is a 501(c)(3) organization that will provide outpatient counseling services for adolescents and adults with substance use disorders. A public announcement, etc., will be forthcoming.
- 5. The Harley Apartment project is wrapping up and should be completed before the end of October. This project has been going very smoothly and is a definite improvement to Munising's downtown.
- D. NEW CITY BUSINESS

5. City Manager Report

City Manager Olson was not in attendance at the meeting, he submitted the following written report:

The resolution regarding the PRNL Visitor Center was provided to all State and Federal legislative representatives. At this time none of the recipients have provided any substantive feed-back on the issue. Additionally, an order for a radar sign has been and should be delivered within 8-12 weeks. The sign has an accompanying solar panel to allow for use without a traditional power supply.

A pre-bid meeting for the Grand Island Township sewer extension was held on site on Thursday the $16^{\rm th}$. The intent of the pre-bid meeting was to ensure that all potential contractors could survey the job site as well as ask any questions regarding the project or project specification book. Five utility contractors and a number of supplier representatives were present which indicates a high level of interest in the project. There will be a public bid opening for the project at City Hall on Thursday, September $23^{\rm rd}$ at 2 PM. Plans and project specifications are available for review at City Hall during normal business hours. If favorable bids are received it is anticipated that a bid review and potential award will occur at the October $6^{\rm th}$ City Commission meeting.

The MDOT Superior Regional Local Bridge Council will be meeting in Ishpeming on Friday, September $24^{\rm th}$. The council will be reviewing project applications for the 2024 construction season such as the City of Munising application that was submitted for the Anna River Bridge this spring. I will be in attendance at the Council meeting to provide a narrative of the application as I am one of four state appointed members of the council.

Gerou Excavating is slated to tentatively begin the Walnut St. reconstruction project the week of the $20^{\rm th}$. Tom Luckey will be the project foreman and they will begin with curb and road removals. The final completion date for the reconstruction project is November $14^{\rm th}$ although the progress scheduled provided by Gerou indicates that paving is slated for the last week of October.

The Notice of Intent regarding the potential pension bonding issue was published in the Mining Journal on Tuesday, September 14th. The publishing date began the 45 public referendum period which is set to expire on October 29th. I have asked the City's municipal financial advisor to join us at the October 6th meeting to review the process as well as give an overview of the potential risk involved in this type of bond issue. I am also hopeful that a representative from MERS will be able to join as well to give an overview of our pension and how MERS investment portfolio works.

BACCO continues to move westward on the utility replacement project in the M-28 corridor. In the past three weeks BACCO and City employees have found and redirected sanitary sewer services from the storm system to our sanitary system. Newly placed water main has been installed and is being pressure tested at this time.
